Earth to have a Christian Burial according to the Discretion of  
my Executors hereafter named And for all my worldly Goods hath  
endowed me withal I Give in manner as followeth, Viz,

I Give to my son David Williams my Best Feathered Bed & Furniture  
with Curtains & Vallains

I Give to my Grandson John Williams son of David Williams three  
pewter Dishes six pewter plates and one Iron pot with pott  
hooks. Item I Give to my Grand Daughter Mary Williams

Daughter of Rich<sup>d</sup>. Williams one pewter Dish  
I Give to my Grandson Eliza Williams one Chest and three Pew-  
ter Basons and one Iron pot & pott hooks one Iron Skillet one  
pewter Tong & sp. of Sticks and one Iron pott Hack

Item. I Give to Mary Altman my best Best and best key  
and my Looking Glass my new spinning Wheel and a pair of  
better lards and my Wadding cloths.

Item And as for all the rest of my Estate both within and without  
of what Nature or Quality soever. I Give to my son John Williams  
And I Do constitute and appoint my son John Williams  
to be my Executor to see this my Will performed In Witness  
whereof I do hereunto set my hand and Seal this 10th Day  
of Septemb. One Thousand Seven Hundred and Forty.
