In the name of God Amen I Mary Gold of the Parish of the Isle of Wight County being sick & weak of body do hereby make my Last & Testament in manner following—

I Give & Bequeath unto my Two Daughters Elizabeth Gold & Mary Gold my Land lying on the Tree dy Branch containing One Acre more or less equally to be Divided according to Quantity & Quality to them & their heirs & if either of my said Daughters Elizabeth or Mary dye without heir then the whole Tract to the Survivor—

I Give & bequeath to my Daughter Mary two feather beds & Furniture and my Chest & all my cloths my Riding Horses Saddle & bridle likewise one Iron Pott, a Bismittle Shillet & brass Shillet & some Shimmer Iron Kettle and fying span Spice mortar & pestle & 3 Quater Dishes & four Basons & 3 Spinning Wheel & a pair of Cards one bow & two year old Hays & two year old Hays & likewise two Sows & piggs, one pair of fine Tonge. If my Daughter Mary dye without heir of personal Estate to be equally Divided Between Thomas & Elizabeth—

I Give & bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Three Spouter Dishes Three Flagg Chairs one Spinning Wheel & Cards cancelled before signing—

I Give & bequeath to my Daughter Mary that part of the foresaid Land lying on the Tree dy Branch; cancelled before signing—

I Give & bequeath to my son Thomas Gold my young Horse and the residue of my Estate not bequeathed after the Doctor is satisfied and my funeral Charges Defrased I say I bequeath the remainder to my son Thomas and thereby Declare this Writing Contents to be my last & Testament hereby Disanulling all other I do hereby leave my Daughter Mary of Age & sixteen years of Age & to enjoy what I have left her and I do hereby constitute & Appoint my well beloved son Thomas Gold my Executor to see & perform the same Witness my hand this 22 Day of February 1784—
