Item and Lastly I do Appoint my Son Peter Williams & my Brother Peter Green to be my whole & sole Executors of this my last Will & Testament as Witnesses my Hand this Twenty seventh of October in the Year of our Lord, one Thousand seven Hundred and Thirty four. hercunto I have set my Hand and Seal.
