In the Name of God Amen. I Nathan Baguel of the Isles of Wight County being very Sick and Weak in Body but of perfect mind and Memory Praises be to Almighty God, to ordain this to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form as followeth. First, I bequeath my Soul to Almighty God who gave it hoping through the Merits of my blessed Saviour Jesus Christ to have Glorification for all my Sins, And my Body I intend in the Earth to have a Christian Burial according to the discretion of my Executors hereafter named, And as for my Temporal Estate — as it hath pleased Almighty God to bestow upon me, I Give and dispose of as followeth. In primis First, I Give unto my Loving Wife Ann Baguel my Plantation I now live on with all priviledges thereunto belonging during her Natural Life. — Next, I Give unto my Son James Baguel my Plantation and all priviledges thereunto belonging after my Wifes Decease, to him and to the Heirs of his Body Lawfully Begotten, I Give to my Son James my Skill Lapp & Worm, and half my Bayle Lark, and my Young Horse, and Pistols & Holsters and my Gun. Item, I Give to my Daughter Mary Baguel my Negro Girl called Hillip and all her Increase. — Item, I Give unto my Daughter Laster Baguel my Young Negro Girl called Doll and all her Increase to be delivered when she comes of Age. Item, I Give to my Daughter Ann Baguel Twelve pounds in Money to be paid by my Executors hereafter named when of Age to receive it. — Item, I Give to my Son Nathan Baguel Ten pounds in Money. — Item, I Give to my Son Rich. Baguel Ten pounds in Money. — Item, I Give to my son Joshua Baguel Ten pounds in Money. — Item, I Give to my son William Baguel Ten pounds in Money. — Item, I Give to my son Samuel Baguel Ten pounds worth of of my Estate. — Item, I leave Eleven pounds in Money to be laid out in Schooling my Children at the discretion of my Executors And I leave Thirty Gallons of Brandy which I have in the House to be sold for Money for —

her Increase
Item, I Give and Bequeath to my Sister Mary, George my
Negro in case of the Money due to her from her Fathers Estate.
Item, I Give and Bequeath to my Sister Hannah, Roger and
Tom Negro Boys in case of the Money due to her from her
Fathers Estate.
