Soul to God that gave it hoping thro' the Merits of my
blessed Saviour Jesus Christ to have Pardon for all my
Sins and as for my Body to be interred in the Earth
to have a Christian Burial according to the Discretion of
my Executors hereafter named and as for all my worldly
Estate I give, sell, bequeath, and assign unto the said Executors

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as follows. Imprimis I give & bequeath unto my
loving Wife Mary Frizzel my best Feather Bed & Furniture
and my riding Horse. Item. I Give to my Daughter
Ann Holyday two Sheep. Item. I Give to my Daughter
Mary Reynolds ten Shillings worth of my Estate. Item.
I give to my Son Ralph Frizzel my Young Horse. And
after my Debts & Funerals Charges are paid the remaining
part of my Estate both within & without I leave to my
loving Wife Mary Frizzel during her Widowhood or during
Life if she remains a Widow and then at her Marriage or
Death to be equally divided between my loving Wife and
my six Children now with me James, John & Joshua,
Elizabeth, Lucy, and Sarah according to Quantity & Quality.
And I do Constitute & Appoint my loving Wife Mary
Frizzel and my Son James Frizzel to be my Executors to
see this my Will performed. In Witness whereof I
have hereunto set my Hand & Seal this 19 day of
January One Thousand seven Hundred & Thirty three.
