

42 The Nuncupative Will of Tristram Moor Deceased taken the 23rd of July 1759

M^r. James Mansom aged about thirty five years deposes that he heard the above said Tristram Moor on his Death Bed say the following words (to wit) I desire my son James may be disinherited his son Thomas for particular reasons (which the Deponent is unknown and that if he lived he would buy Lands in this side of the River for his said Son and that he designed all his Lands in Gloucester for his Son James and further saith not — James Mansom

Joyce Correll aged thirty or thereabouts deposes that she heard the above said Tristram Moor on his Death Bed say the following words (to wit) I desire my son James may have all my Lands in Gloucester County and I desire that my loving Father may take my said Son James and bring him up and further saith not — Joyce Correll

Rodger & Stanley aged Forty five years or thereabouts deposes that he heard the above said Tristram Moor on his Death Bed say the following words (to wit) I desire that my son Thomas may be disinherited of all my Lands in Gloucester and that my son Thomas may have Twenty pounds to buy other Lands in this side of and further saith not — Rodger & Stanley

In the Name of God Amen I Randan Threl being sick but of perfect sense and memory, do make & ordain this my Last will and Testament first and principally I bequeath my soul into the hand of Almighty God and my body I commit to the ground to be decently buried at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter named —

I give and bequeath unto my Loving son Joseph John Threl the plantation whereon I now live and Two hundred and fifty acres of Land thereunto belonging to him my said son and the heirs of his body lawfully begotten —

I give unto my loving son Matthew Threl one hundred and thirty acres of Land it being the Land I bought of William Thomas, to him my said Son and the heirs of his body lawfully begotten —

I give unto my Loving son Holladay Threl one certain Tract of Land lying on Round hill Swamp being by patent Eighty five acres of Land to him my said Son and the heirs of his body lawfully begotten —

and lastly I do appoint and constitute my Son Joseph John Threl my

whole and sole Executor to this my Last Will and Testament swearing all what
 that hath been made by me in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand &
 Seal the 23rd day of Decem^r. 1733

In the Name of God Amen I Robert Eley Son of the late of Wight
 County being in Reasonable health of Body & of good Sound & perfect Sense &
 memory blessed be God but calling to mind the uncertainty of this frail life
 and that it is appointed for all flesh to dye I therefore do make this my
 Last Will & Testament in manner and form following

Item I Give and bequeath unto my Son Robert Eley one hundred Acres of Land more
 or less bounding on the Long Branch and so along John Roberts his Cart
 path that he leads to Cart Bar and so up Little Branch to a place called
 holly Service to Henry Sanders his line and so along that line and John Roberts
 his line to Mr John Sears line to a corner white oak in a little plantation
 and all the Land that I do possess down to the main Swamp to him and his
 heirs for ever

Item I Give and bequeath unto my Son James Eley one hundred & fifty Acres of Land
 more or less beginning at the head of the Long Branch to the holly pond and so
 from the holly pond down the branch to a corner pine in John Roberts his
 line and so down the line to a corner Red oak and so along the line between Mr
 Jeremiah Coom and my self to a little Branch called the black piper branch
 and so up the said branch to John Roberts his Cart path to him and his heirs for
 ever

Item I Give and bequeath unto my son Edward Eley Eighty Acres of Land more or
 less beginning at a corner tree that was formerly Samuel Watsons corner tree
 and so taking along that line to the main Swamp and so up the main Swamp
 to the foot of the branch called the pasture branch and so up the branch to the
 head line and so along the head line to Samuel Watsons corner tree to him and
 his heirs for ever

Item I Give and bequeath unto my son John Eley Eighty Acres of Land more or less
 on the south side of the main Swamp along Samuel Watsons line to Thos
 Parkers line and so along Thos Parkers line to Mr Jeremiah Coom's line
 and from thence to the main Swamp to him & his heirs for ever

Item I Give and bequeath unto my son Michael Eley the plantation whereon
 I now live with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging to him and his
 heirs for ever
