In the name of God Amen
of May in Year of our Lord one Thousand seven Hundred thirty
and four I Robert Carr calling to Mind the uncertainty of this
Life and know that it is appointed for all Men once to Die thought
fitt being of sound & perfect Memory praise be to God therefore
have made this my last Will & Testament in manner & form
following First I recommend my Soul into the hands of the
Almighty God that gave it and my Body to the grave to be decently
Buried

at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named. And as for my
 Worldly Goods that it has pleased God to bless me withall I
 give & bequeath the same in manner & form following To-wit
 I Give & Bequeath unto my loving Wife Mary Carr the Use of
 my dwelling Houseing and the one half of all the tract of Land
 belonging to the said Plantation with all the Appurtenances &
 Profits thereunto belonging during her Natural Life: And the
 other Half of any Land I Give & Bequeath to my Son Robert
 Carr, and after the Death of his Mother Mary Carr afore-
 mentioned I Give & Bequeath unto my said Son Robert Carr
 all that tract of Land & Plantation whereon I now live unto
 my said Son Robert Carr and to his Heirs or Assigns for ever
 I also Give unto my loving Wife Mary Carr the Use of one Horse
 Bridle & Saddle during her natural Life. Item I Give unto
 my Daughter Elizabeth Darden one seat & then Trunk to her
 to be her Use for ever. I also Give her five Shillings Current
 money it being in full of her Part of my Estate, and I do
 give to my said Daughter Elizabeth Darden or any Person
 claiming under or for her any part or parcel of my Estate after
 my death more than the Legacies that I have before mentioned in
 this present Writing. And as for the rest of my moveable
 Estate I give it to be equally divided in quantity & quality between
 my beloved Wife Mary Carr and my Son Robert Carr to them
 and to their Heirs & Assigns for ever. And I do Appoint and
 Ordain my loving Wife Mary Carr & my Son Robert Carr to be
 my sole Executors & Executrix of this my last Will & Testament
 In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and affixed
 my Seal this Day and Year first above written.
