In the Name of God Amen I Robert Harris being
of perfect sense and Memory do make and Ordain this my Last
Will and Testament first and principally I Bequeath my Soul to
God who gave it and my Body I Commit to the ground to be decen-
tly buried by Executors here after Named

Item I Give unto my Daughter Ann Harris one Quarter Part and
a fourth

Furniture that was called his
I Give unto my son Charles Harris One Feather Bed and Furniture
Called the great Bed

I Give unto my son Michael Harris the next best Bed and Furni-
ture I Give unto my son Joseph Harris One Feather Bed &
Furniture it being the Bed that was called my Bed - I Give unto
my son James Harris One Feather Bed and Furniture. And it is -
my Will and Desire that five pounds Cash be allowed out of my
Estate to my son Mathew to purchase him a Bed and Furniture
to Equal him with his Sister and Brothers.

It is my Will and Desire that my Stock of Cattle be Equally -
Divided Between my Daughter Ann Harris and my five sons
Michael, Charles, Joseph, James, and Mathew, also my Estate
in plots and few to be Equally Divided between my six
Children above mentioned - I Give unto my Daughter Ann
One Loom and all the Gear thereunto belonging -

I Give unto my sons Robert, John, Michael, Charles, Joseph, James and
Mathew all my Smiths Tools to be Equally Divided amongst
them - I Give ^{unto} my Daughter Ann One small Trunk I Give unto
my two sons James and Mathew my Plantation and all the
Land thereunto belonging to Equally Divided in Quantity be-
tween them and their Heirs for ever, And all the rest of my Estate
Goods and Chattles whatsoever to be Equally Divided amongst all
my Children and I do appoint my son Michael Harris my Executor
to this my last Will and Testament taking all othor will hereto-
fore made by me In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
Hand and Seal this 22nd Day of March 1739
