of the Isle of Wight County being very sick and weak in my bed of good soues
and perfect memory at present thankes be to god for me to be heare my last
Will and testament in manner and forme as followeth first give my loue
unto the Almighty God who gave it unto me secondly my loue to the Earth
I to be buried in a Christian manner at the discretion of my Ex: & C: here
after mentioned and as for all my worldly goods and Lasses given them as
followeth Item I give unto my Son John Leggan half my Land with my
plantation included in it being the uppemost part on the maine way
I give it to him and the heirs of his body lawfully begotten for ever
Item I give unto my Son Robert Leggan the other half of my Land I give it to
him and the heirs of his body lawfully begotten for ever
Item I give unto my daughter Elizabeth Stevens One shilling or more
Item I give unto my daughter Ann Stevens One shilling or more
Item I give unto my daughter Sarah Leggan one feather bed one rugge and
One blanket and shekets and one pewter dish One bacon pan plates and Six
spoons and one Iron pott and one cow and calf and one sow and pigs all to be
delivere to her at the age of eighteen or married
Item I give unto my loving wife Sarah Leggan one feather bed & the furni-
ture belonging to it as my will and desire is that she may haue her
choice of my beds and one large chest and 16 pewter plates and two small
dishes and one flaggon and two cows & calves and two sows and pigs and one
iron pot and hooks and one Woolen wheel
Item I give all the remaineर part of my Estate after my just debts are paid
to be Equally divided between my two Sons John Leggan & Robert Leggan and
I do constitute appoint and Ordaine my loving wife Sarah Leggan & my son John
Leggan my whole and sole Ex: & C: of this my last will and testamēt
Mr Webbe whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this thirty day
of January One thousand seuen hundred & thirty nine
