

In the name of God Amen I Robert Smalley
 being sick & weak in Body but perfect in Memory do first testifie & certify
 give & bequeath unto God Almighty my Soul who gave it to me
 Secondly my Body to the Earth to be buried in decent & Christian like
 manner. Thirdly I do Give & Bequeath unto my Son John Smalley One
 hundred Acres of Land more or less within the Bounds hereafter mentioned
 beginning at a markt white Oak at the Mouth of Dardens Mill pond
 so running a Straight Line to a Pine Tree a Line Tree between Mr
 Hardin and I, and so all the Land up towards Purcells Mill to the
 extent of my Patent I do Give it to him and his Heirs for ever.
 Fourthly I do Give & Bequeath unto my Son Thomas Smalley fifty
 Acres of Land more or less joining on Anthony Covington Holiday
 and Gardens and so to the first long Branch that runs up to
 the Pocofson to him and his Heirs for ever. Fifthly I do Give
 and Bequeath unto my Son Robert Smalley my Plantation where
 I now dwell and all the rest of my Land that belongs to the
 said Plantation I Give it to him and his Heirs for ever.
 Sixthly I do Give unto my Son John Smalley all my Land that is
 between William Powells Line and the Branch next to my Quarter
 so bounded as the Path goes to Francis Hampton through the Ridge
 of Pines. I Give it to him and his Heirs for ever. ^(and I after give him Negro Man called Tom to him & his Heirs for ever) Seventhly
 I do Give to my Son Thomas Smalley the Plantation where my Negroes
 live on now and all the Remainder part of Land that I have not
 disposed of I Give it to him and his Heirs for ever And I will
 give him two Negroes a Wench called Joan and a Boy called
 Dick to him and his Heirs for ever. Eighthly I Give to my Son
 Robert two Negroes a Wench called Venus and a Boy called Sharper
 to him and his Heirs for ever. Ninthly I Give a Negro Wench
 called Mife to my two sons Thomas & Robert and my Will and
 Desire is that the said Negro shall live with either of them as
 she shall make Choice of for her Master. Tenthly I Give
 all my Powder to my three Sons John, Thomas, & Robert to be
 equally divided between them. Eleventhly I do Give unto my
 two Sons Thomas & Robert Smalley all the Remainder part of
 my Estate both in Doors and Out be it of what nature or kind
 soever to be equally divided between them; And I do Appoint and
 Ordain my two Sons Thomas & Robert to be my whole & sole Executors
 of this my last Will & Testament As Witness my Hand
 and Seal this second Day of August One Thousand seven
 Hundred and Thirty four.
