In the name of God Amen. Philip Wheadon being in perfect Senses & Memory praised be God for it do make this my last Will & Testament in manner as followeth (viz) First & Principally I recommend my Soul into the Hands of Almighty God that gave it, hoping through the Meritorious Death & Passion of my only Saviour Jesus Christ to have full Pardon & Remission of all my sins and my Body to be decently Buried by my Executor hereafter mentioned. And for such Worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bestow on me I dispose of as followeth. *Inprimis* I Give & Bequeath to my loving Son James Wheadon Negro Boy Peter and Negro Girl called Nanny, and one Malatto Boy called Harry. And I desire he may be set free at the Age of Twenty one Years. *Item*. I Give to my loving Son Joseph Wheadon One Negro Woman called Jane. One Negro Boy called Dick. One Negro Girl called Jane. And all the rest of my Estate after all my just Debts paid to be equally Divided between my Son James & Joseph Wheadon. And I do Nominate & Appoint my Son Joseph Wheadon my whole & sole Executor, and I do Appoint my good friends Mr Lawrence Barber, John Hodges, and John Godrich to see the rest of my Estate equally divided.

The last Will & Testament of Philip Wheadon deceased was presented in Court by Joseph Wheadon the Executor therein named who made Oath thereto according to Law and being proved by the Oaths of the Witnesses therein it is admitted to Record.

Virginia sc. October the 25 1735. Robert Vick of the County of Wight in Walloway Parish Planter being very Sick & weak of Body but of perfect Mind & Memory thanks be to Almighty God for the same. And knowing that it is Appointed by Almighty God for all Men once to Die I do hereby commit my Soul unto the Hands of God who gave it me and my Body to be decently Buried at the Discretion of my Executors, and as for what it hath pleased Almighty God to Bless me with I Give & Bequeath in manner and form as followeth. *Item*

First I Give & Bequeath to my Son Robert Vick one Negro Boy named Harry with fifty Acres of Land joining to William Faircloth. Secondly I Give & Bequeath to my Son Joseph the Plantation where John Harrold lives with the half of the Land adjoining to the same out of a Patent granted to me for One Hundred Acres, and the remainder of the said Patent I Give & Bequeath to my Benjamin the other part of the same said Patent. And I Give & Bequeath to my Son Nathan the Plantation the which now live on with One Negro Boy named Sharper. And if either or more of my said Sons should decease without Heir their parts to fall to the next Heir that is if Robert dies without Heir his part to fall to Joseph, and if they both die without Heir their parts to fall to Nathan & Benjamin and these I give & bequeath after my decease and to my said Sons to Inherit the same at Sixteen Years of Age except the Manor Plantation for my loving Wife Sarah during her Natural Life except she should Marry and then to be Disinherited only a Childs Part. And fifty Shillings I give & bequeath to be taken out of my Estate so put my four Sons to School that is fifty Shillings a piece. And I Give and Bequeath to my son Benjamin Ten pounds Cash. And the rest of my Estate after all just Debts paid I give and bequeath to be equally divided between them that is to my loving Wife Sarah and all my Sons and Daughters only to my Daughter Mary I give & bequeath to her One Shilling. And I make & ordain my loving Wife Sarah Executor with my son Robert of this my last Will & Testament and Naming this to be my last Will and Testament and none other. And my Estate I desire not to be divided except my loving Wife Sarah should Marry till her decease neither to be taken out of her Hands except she Marry. And own this my last Will & Testament and none other As Witness my Hand & Seal.
