the 22 day of March 1734. I Thomas Bevan of the
Isle of Wight County being very sick & Weak in Body but of
perfect Sense & Memory Thanks be to Almighty God, and calling
to Mind the certainty of Death but the Uncertainty of the Time
when and being willing to settle my Temporal Affairs do make
constitute & ordain this my last Will & Testament revoking &
disannulling all other Wills & Testaments by me heretofore made
and this only to be taken & deemed for my last Will and
Testament in manner & form following First I recommend
my Soul to God that gave it and my Body to the Earth to be

Buried in such decent manner as my Executive hereafter named
shall think fitt and as touching my Temporal Estate I dispose
of it as followeth. Imprimis I Give & Bequeath to my
Son Thomas Bevan my Negro Man Tony to him and his
Heirs for ever to be delivered to him at the Age of
Twenty One or Day of Marriage, and likewise three Cows &
batoes and two Pewter Dishes, and my Hand Gun, and one
Iron Spit, and either a young Horse or Mare. Item.
I Give & Bequeath to my three Sons George, Robert and
Joseph Bevan and likewise my Daughter Mary Bevan
to each of them one young Horse or Mare. Item I Give
and Bequeath to my loving Wife Mary Bevan the Use of
all the residue of my Estate of what kind soever during her
Widowhood, but in case she should marry again my Will &
Desire is that she should have so much of my Estate as is
due to her by Law and no more, and the remaining part to be
equally divided between my four youngest Children (viz) George
Robert Joseph & Mary Bevan. And I do constitute & Create
my loving Wife Mary Bevan and my Son Thomas Bevan true
whole & sole Executrix, & Executor of this my last Will &
Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set
Hand and affixed my Seal the Day & Year above written -
