Lower parish of Isle of Wight County being sick and weak of body
but of perfect mind and memory do make this my last will and testament
committing my soul to Almighty God and my body to the grave
and as for my worldly Estate which hereafter is expressed
I give and dispose of the same in the following manner
I give and bequeath to my true loving sons James Carter
and Benjamin Carter one certain Survey or Tract of Land lying
and being in the parish & County aforesaid and on the North
side of Williams River and bordering upon George's Bay his

Land and George Carter & W. Edwards his Son to be equally divided
between them both and if either of my aforesaid Sons shall die with-
out issue then give all the aforesaid Tract of Land to the other Son
and his heirs and assigns for ever —

Then I give and bequeath to my loving Son Samuell Carter the Planta-
tion whereon now live containing by patent One Hundred and
twenty Acres to him & his heirs & assigns for ever — and if
my said Son Samuell should die without heirs then to be bound to my Son
William Carter and his heirs for ever —

Then I give and bequeath to my Son Samuell Carter a Negro Girl called
Anny with her gear orase and one Iron pot and five pewter basons and
two pewter Dishes and one feather bed and one worsted shag Tugg with
other Furniture thereto belonging & one horse & ten head of Cattle —
Then I give and bequeath to my Son Benjamin One Negro man called Jack
and one great Iron pot —

Then I give unto my Son James Carter One Negro man called Sam —
Then I give and bequeath unto my Loving Wife Elizabeth Carter and
to my two Daughters Elizabeth and Ann all the rest of my Estate to
be equally divided amongst them I likewise appoint my Loving Wife
Elizabeth Carter to be my whole and Sole Executrix of this my last
Will & Testament ratifying & confirming this and no other to be
my last will & Testament In Witnes whereof I have hereunto set
my hand & seal this 10th day Nov^r 1732
