In the name of God Amen I Thomas Cook of Isle of Wight County being very sick & weak of Body but of perfect Sense and Memory thanks be to God & calling to mind the Uncertainty of this life as knowing its Appropritate to all men Once to die & being desirous to settle things in Order do make constitute Ordain and appoint this and no other to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say first and principally I recommend my Soul into the hands of God who gave it neither Doubting but to receive the same again at the joyful Resurrection at his last day with a full pardon of all my Sins & Transgressions thro' the Death of my Blessed Saviour & Redeemer Jesus Christ & my Body to the said John when it was taken to be buried in a decent and Christian manner and as touching such Worldly Estate as the Lord in mercy hath lent me my Will and meaning is that the same be Sold & disposed So near and form following

Item I give and bequeath to my Son Thomas Cook One hundred Acres of Land part of the Tract whereon I live beginning at the Holy Trinity Branch & running up the said Branch to the Outside line to him his heirs and Assigns for ever. Item I give and bequeath to my Son Jones Cook One hundred & fifty Acres part of the aforesaid Tract beginning at the mouth of the aforesaid branch and running down the tract to contain at least one hundred and fifty Acres aforesaid to him his heirs and Assigns for ever. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah One Cow and Calf & a hog & a young Bay mare that is usually called her. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Susannah a young Sorrel mare a Cow & Calf and a hog. Item I give and bequeath to my Son Benjamin One Narrow Street Sack Bed and the furniture belonging to it. Item I give and bequeath to my Son John the Bed which is usually lay on & the furniture belonging to it. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Rebecca One Dynabrigs Sack Bed & the furniture belonging to it. Item I give and bequeath to my Son Arthur One new felt hat & I do hereby constitute & appoint My Sons Thomas Cook & Jones Cook Whole Sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament desiring them to dispose of the goods & Chathles as is Appointed in this my Will. In Witnes whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 21. day of January 1735/6 & Signed Sealed & Subscribed in presence of us

and Testament Renouncing all former Wills and Legacies afore made.
I give and bequeath my Soul to God who gave it to me and my Body to
the Earth to be decently Buried as my Executors shall think fitt -
Then I give and bequeath to my Son James Wright two Thousand Acres
of Land whereon he now lives bounding On that side the Deep branch
be the same more or less to him and his heirs for ever -
Then likewise give and bequeath to my Son James Wright five Shillings
Curr^{ent} money of Virginia -
Then I give and bequeath to my Son John Wright three Thousand Acres of
Land lying on the North side of the of the aforesaid Branch which is to
say all my Land on that side of the Branch be the same more or less -
Then I likewise give and bequeath to my Son John Wright all that tract
of Land & Plantation whereon I now live all of both mentioned parcels
to him & his heirs for ever -
I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Browne One feather bed
and furniture & two Cows and four Sheep & 2 dishes 2 basons & 2 plates
