And that after the Debts due from the Estate of my said Deceased Husband and from me be justly paid and the Legacies delivered, that y^e Estate then remaining of what Nature Quality or Condition soever it be that I am or ought to be possessed with be equally divided amongst my loving Children. Henry, Lawrence, James, William, Mary, Sarah & Katherine revoking all former Wills by me made I do Ordain this to be my last Will & Testament. And do Appoint my said Son Lawrence Baker to be Executor thereof. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and fixed my Seal this fifth day of March 1732.

Remainder of my whole Estate to my Daughter Elizabeth and to her heirs after my just Debts is paid. And if that it is please God that she shall live to the Age of eighteen or Married that then she should be wholly possessed with the whole Estate, and if it please God that she should depart this Life before that she should attain to that Age mentioned. That all her Estate should be equally divided between the Sons of my three Brothers to my Sister Providence Whrenn. And it is my Will & Desire that my Executors should sell as much of the Estate as they shall think is perishing, and if they can conveniently to buy a small Negro Girl with the Money for my Daughter. And I do Appoint my loving Brother Samuel Davis & my Friend James Day my whole & sole Executors of this my last Will As Witness my Hand & Seal this 15th of August 1734.
