In the name of God Amen I the Sonell of the Isle of Wight County Do make and Declare this my Last Will and Testament revoking all other and former Wills in manner and form following. First I Commit into the Hands of allmighty God my Body to be buried at discretion of my Executors hereafter named and my Real and Personall Estate I Give and Dispose thereof in mannor and form following.

Item My Desire is my W^{ill} to man named William should live on my plantation called the New Quarter during his Life and have two Slaves to work under him one named Jeff the other named Young Peter and that he shall have the third of what he makes and raises and the other two parts to go to Thomas Jarrell and if either of these two slaves afore named should Dye that thes^d Jarrell should put a nother slave under him.

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Grandson Thomas Jarrell one Negro woman named Bess and in his possession and he increase to him and his Heirs for ever.

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Ann Jarrell one side saddle and Bridle now in her possession to she and her Heirs for ever.

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Parker one Comb and Keys & Harp now in ^{her} possession to she and her Heirs for ever.

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Grandson Thomas Parker one

two Negroes in the possession of Richard Barker one man named
Pompy and one Woman named Jite and his Increase to him and
his heirs for ever.

I Give and Bequeath unto my son Thomas Jarrell my Chase and
Hornage. - I Give and Bequeath unto my Grandson Tho.
Jarrell all my Lands that I am now possessed with except a piece
of woodland Ground from the Edge of the Ridge old field to my son
Thomas Jarrell line. And I Give unto him my Mill which is now
a going Mill on my Land. I Give unto my Grandson Tho. Jarrell
all my Negroes namely, Peter, Nan, Frank, Roger, Dick, Harry,
Lizzy, Grace, Jue, Peter, Joe, Lydia, and Abram Freeman.
And all the residue of my Estate both Goods and Chattels to him
and his Heirs for ever. and my desire is that he should Receive the
aboves. Estate when he comes to the Age of Twenty One Years and
if my Grandson Thomas Jarrell should Die without Heir that my
Estate shall fall unto my son Tho. Jarrell and his Heirs for ever.
And I do Appoint my Loving Son Thomas Jarrell my whole
and Sole Executor to this my last Will & Testament. In Witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this Twentieth
day of April 1741.
