In the Name of God Amen. I Thomas Parker  
of the Sales of Wight County being at time in perfect Memory thro the  
Mercy of God do make this my last Will and Testament in manner  
and form as followeth, that is to say, -  
Item I Give to my Eldest son William all my Lands and Tenements to him  
and his Heirs, and my Black Ware, and Saddle & Bridle & Pistols &  
Holsters; I also Give the Use of my Plantation and Mill to my  
Wife during her Widowhood, -  
Item, I Give to my Son Elias one Negro called Jude -  
Item, I Give to my Daughter Ann one Negro Girl called Luce -  
Item, I Give to my Son Thomas and my son Willmison and my Daughter  
Priscilla and my Daughter Salre forty pounds Cash to be Equally  
Divided between them four, -  
Item, I Give to my Grandson Elisha Three pounds Cash -  
Item, I Give to my Daughter Rachel one Feather Bed & Furniture -  
Item, I Give all the rest of my Estate to my Loving Wife with in  
and without for the use of bringing up of my Children, I also make  
and constitute my Loving Wife to be my Whole & sole Executrix  
of this my last Will and Testament, I have unto set my Hand  
and Seal this 30 Day of January 1735 -
