 I Give and bequeath to my son John Sumnerrell one Negro Woman
 named Harinah and one Negro Girl named Selah & their Increase
 and all my Wearing Cloths.
 I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Wilson one Negro Man
 named Jack and one Negro Girl named Jess and her Increase.
 I Give and Bequeath to my son John Sumnerrell one Mallato fellow
 named Dick and one Negro Wench named Essie & one Negro fellow
 called Peter and one Negro Wench called Nan and one Negro Boy
 called Toby and one Negro Boy called James and all their Increase.
 I Give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Mary Wainwright one
 Negro Girl called Jane, and to my Grand Daughter Sarah Wain-
 right half the Increase of the same Negro Girl and in case an Child
 be to the afore^d Sarah Wainwright I Give to my Grand Daugh-
 ter Mary Wainwright one Silver Chest that was her fathers.
 I Give & Bequeath to my Grand Daughter Martha Wilson one Gold
 Ring and in case she dies without heir, I bequeath all the Rest of
 my Estate to be Divided into two parts the one half to my son John
 Sumnerrell and the other half to be Equally Divided between my
 son John Sumnerrell and my Daughter Sarah Wilson my Will and
 Order is my son John Sumnerrell pay five pounds Cash to each of
 my Daughter Mary Wainwrights Children, and five pounds Cash
 to my Grand Daughter Jane Sumnerrell.
 I bequeath my son John Sumnerrell my whole and soul & all of this
 my Last Will and Testament.
