Item, I Give and Bequeath to my Sister Molisah a Negro Wench
called Sue and her Increase in case of the Money due to her from her
Hathens Estate.
Item, I Give to my Sister Elizabeth my Negro Wench Rose and
her Increase
Item, I Give and Bequeath to my Sister Mary, George my
Negro in case of the Money due to her from her Hathens Estate.
Item, I Give and Bequeath to my Sister Hannah, Roger and
Tom Negro Boys in case of the Money due to her from her
Hathens Estate.

Item, I Give and Bequeath to John Clark the sum of ~~one~~ ^{one} hundred and fifty pounds to buy my Negro Fellow called Robin, And as for my last Will and Testaments my Will is that they should be equally divided among my Sisters.

Item, I Give and Bequeath to my Sister Deborah my Horse Wholly, And as for the Remainder of my Estate after my Just Debts paid, I Order my Goods to be Sold and to be equally Divided among my Sisters. Item, I Give and Bequeath to Henry Harrison the Cloth and Trimming that is in the Wreath and as for the remainder of my Wearing Apparel I leave to be Equally Divided between Henry Harrison and Thomas Clark.

Item, I Give and Bequeath to Elizabeth Daugh a Guinea to Buy her a Mourning Ring, Item, I Give and Bequeath to Henry Harrison my Gun, Item, I Leave to the Minister of the Parish of our Parish for a Funeral Sermon, I do Appoint my Brothers Henry Harrison and Thomas Clark my whole and sole Executors of this my last Will & Testament and my Estate not to be Appraised nor Security Given
