William Bradshaw of Newport Parish in the Isle of Wight County being very sick and weak but of perfect and sound memory thanks be to God, I have thought fitt to make this my Last Will & Testament I Bequeath my Soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it me and my Body to the Earth to be buried in Decent Christian like manner and as for my worldly Goods I have thought fitt to bestow as followeth

- Item I Give and Bequeath unto my loving Brother Richard Bradshaw one Hundred Acres of Land being the plantation he now lives upon to him & his Heirs for ever
 - Item I Give unto my Daughter Emily Bradshaw the manner plantation now live upon containing one Hundred & fifty Acres to her and her Heirs for ever
 - Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Bradshaw one Hundred Acres of Land joining upon the Land of my Brother Richard Bradshaw and so upon the Land of Richard Weston to her and her Heirs for ever
 - Item I Give unto my Daughter Mary Bradshaw one shilling sterling as her full share of my Estate
 - Item I Give unto my Daughter Emily Bradshaw all the rest of my moveable Estate to her and her Heirs for ever
 - Item I Give unto my Cousin Richard Bradshaw my two Guns for ever
 - Item I Appoint my Loving Brother Richard Bradshaw my whole Executor to this my Last Will & Testament Disannulling all other Wills as may be produced as Acknowledging no other in Witness whereof I have hereunto fixed my Hand in the presence of

In the Name of God Amen I Benj: Weston of the Isle of Wight County being very sick and weak in Body but of perfect mind & Memory praise be to Almighty God Do make this to be my last will & Testament In manner and form as follows
I Bequeath my soul to God who gave it hoping through the merits of my blessed Saviour Jesus Christ to have pardon for all my sins & as for my Body to be Entere'd in the Earth to have a Christian burial according to the Discretion of my Exors hereafter named and as for all my worldly Goods God hath

Indeavored me with all I Give in manner as followeth (Vizt)
I Give to my Loving Wife Isabella Weston all that part of my Estate which was her own when I was married to her
And as for that part of my Estate which was my own when I was married I leave to my Loving Wife to be valued and out of the Valuation thereof to pay my Debts & after my Debts is paid the remaining part I Give to be Equally Divided between my Loving Wife Isabella and my three Children Joseph Mary and Samuel
And I Do Appoint my Loving Wife Isabella Weston to be my whole Exors to see this my Will performed as Witnefs my hand this 27th Day of Septemb: 1739
