In the name of God Amen the twentieth fourth day of
December in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and
thirty five I William Baker of the Isle of Wight County being in
good health of body and sound and perfect mind and Memory
thanks be given to God therefor calling unto mind the mortality of
my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die

to make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament that is to say prime-
 pally and first of all I give and Recommend my Soul into the hands of
 God that gave it and for my Body I Recommend it to the Earth to be buried
 in a Christian like manner at the discretion of my Executor nothing doubt-
 ing but at the final Resurrection I shall receive the same again by
 the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it
 hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give devise and dispose of the same
 in the following manner and form — Item I give and bequeath to Anthony
 Crocker my Son One hundred Acres of Land more or less being part of the
 tract of Land wherupon I now live being parted by a deep branch on the South
 side of my Mannor plantation all on the South side of the said branch to him
 and his heirs for ever — Item I give to my Son Peter Crocker the remainder part
 of my land being the plantation wherupon I now dwell One hundred acres
 more or less to him and his heirs for ever — Item I give and bequeath to
 my Son Arthur Crocker all my wearing clothes and One puer. bason and
 one Chair — Item I give and bequeath to my Son William Crocker One
 long table one pewter bason and one Chair — Item I give and bequeath to
 my Son Anthony Crocker One chest and 1 puer. bason and 1 Chair —
 Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizth One chest and one looking
 glass and One bason — Item I give and bequeath to my Son Peter Crocker
 one pair of pistols and holsters and one pewter bason and one Chair —
 All the rest and Residue of my personal Estate Goods and Chattels whatev-
 er I do give and bequeath to my loving wife Catherine Crocker my full and
 Executor of this my last will & Testament and I do hereby Cooke I name
 and make void all former wills & Testaments by me heretofore made
 Witnesses wherof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and
 year above Written —
