Plantation cohesion I now dwell or the Interest of the same & my
Cows and One large pewster Sackhard & five Cows and Calves & three
Sows and pigs & One large Iron pot & One pewster dish & three pounds
fifteen Shillings Cash

Item I give ^{bequeath} unto my Son John Worrel Ten pounds Cash to be raised
out of the Brown Hogs or Cattle and One New Feather Bed & furniture
and One pewster dish and four Cows and Calves & three Sows & pigs -

Item I give and bequeath to my Honour'd Father my new Wearing
and One pair of Stockings to be deliver'd Instantly to him after my Death

Item I give and bequeath to my Loving Wife Ann Worrel all the rest
of my Estate both Real & personal except what shall defray my Ex-
ecutors Charges whom I constitute and appoint and have my loving
friend John Brew Junr to be my full and Whole Executor and this I allow
to be my last Will & Testament as Witness my hand this 21st day of
September 1736

In the name of God Amen I Thomas Cook of Isle of Wight County being very sick & weak of Body but of perfect Sense and Memory thanks be to God & calling to mind the Uncertainty of this life as knowing its Appointed date all men Once to die & being desirous to settle things in Order do make constitute Ordain and appoint this and no other to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say first and principally I recommend my Soul into the hands of God who gave it without Doubting but to receive the same again at the joyful Resurrection at His last day with a full pardon of all my Sins & Transgressions thro' the Death of my Blessed Saviour & Redeemer Jesus Christ & my Body to the said God from whom it was taken to be buried in a decent and Christian manner and as touching such Worldly Estate as the Lord in mercy hath lent me my Will and meaning is that the same be Sold & disposed in manner and form following

Item I give and bequeath to my Son Thomas Cook One hundred Acres of Land part of the Tract whereon I live beginning at the Holy Church Branch & running up the said Branch to the Outside Line to my husband's and Assigns for ever. Item I give and bequeath to my Son Jones Cook One hundred & fifty Acres part of the aforesaid Tract beginning at the mouth of the aforesaid branch and running down the bank to contain at one hundred and fifty Acres aforesaid to him his heirs and Assigns for ever. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah One Cow and Calf & a half first a young Bay mare that is usually called heres. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Susannah a young Sorrel mare a Cow & Calf and a half. Item I give and bequeath to my Son Benjamin One Narrow Street Sack Bed and the furniture belonging to it. Item I give and bequeath to my Son John the Bed which I usually lay on & the furniture belonging to it. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Rebecca One Dynabings Sack Bed & the furniture belonging to it. Item I give and bequeath to my Son Arthur One new felt Matt. & I do hereby constitute & appoint My Sons Thomas Cook & Jones Cook Whole Sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament desiring them to dispose of the goods & Chathels as is Appointed in this my Will. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 21. day of January 1735/6 & Signed Sealed & Delivered in presence of us
