In the name of God Amen I William Worrell of the Isle
of Wight County in Virginia being sick and weak of Body but of my
full mind and Memory thank be given to God for it & calling to mind
the Mortality of Mans Body & as for what worlds body is hath please-
ed God to bestow on me I give and bequeath as followeth: first my Son
to Almighty God & hoping to be with Christ at the Resurrection of
all my just Debt being truly paid and a decent Christian Burial
at the Discretion of my Executors etc

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son William Worrell my Land and
Plantation wherion I now Dwell or the Interest of the same & my
Cows and One large peaster Sack-hord & five Cows and Calves & three
Sows and pigs & One large Iron pot & One peaster dish & three young
fifteen Shillings Cash

Item I give unto my Son John Worrell Ten pounds Cash to be raised
out of the Crown-hogs or Cattle and One New feather Bed & Quon-tu-
red One peaster dish and four Cows and Calves & three Sows & pigs -
Item I give and bequeath to my Honourable Father my new Wearing
and Draper of Stockings to be delivered Instantly to him after my death
Item I give and bequeath to my Loving Wife Ann Worrell the sum
of my Estate both Real & personal except what shall defray my last
Charges whom I constitute and appoint and have my loving
friend John Bow Junr to be my full and Whole Executor and shall allow
to be my last Will & Testiment as witness my hand this 21 day of
September 1730

In the name of God Amen I Thomas Cook Sen^r of Isle of Wight
County being very sick & weak of Body but of perfect Sense and Memory
thankes be to God & calling to mind the uncertainty of this life as knowing
its Appointt^d do to all men Once to live being desirous to settle things in
Order to make Constitute Ordain and appoint this and no other to be my last
Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say first and
Principally I recommend my Soul into the hands of God who gave it nothing
Doubting but to receive the same again at the full & Confession at his
last day with a full pardon of all my Sins & Transgessions thru the death
of my blessed Saviour & Redeemer Jesus Christ Only to the best
of my knowledge it was taken to be buried in a decent Land Christian manner
and as touching such worldly Estate as the same in every hatt^t left
me my Will and meaning is that the same be sold logo & disposed to use
men and form following

Item I give and bequeath to my Son Thomas Cook One hundred Acres of
Land part of the tract whereon I have beginning at the Holy Bush^t
Branch running up the said Branch to the outside line to my hatt^t
and Apigns forever. Item I give and bequeath to my Son Jones Cook
One hundred & fifty Acres part of the aforesaid tract beginning at the
mouth of the aforesaid branch and running down the bridle containe it
doth and fifti Acres aforesaid to him his heirs and Apigns forever then
I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah one Cow and Calf & a heifer
a young Bay mare that is usually called her. Item I give and bequeath
to my Daughter Isannah a young Sorrel mare a Cow & Calf and a heifer
Item I give and bequeath to my Son Benjamin one Harrow Street Shovel
Bed and the furniture belonging to it. Item I give and bequeath to my
Son the Bed which I usually lay on & the furniture belonging to it
Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Rebecca One Dignabys Set
Bed & the furniture belonging to it. Item I give and bequeath to my Son
Arthur Cook one new flet bed & I do hereby Constitute & appoint
My Sons Thomas Cook & Jones Cook Whole Sole Executors of this my
last Will and Testament desiring them to dispose of the said
Chattels as is appointed in this my Will in witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and Seal this 21st day of January 1730/1
