I Abraham Ricks of the Isle of Wight County in Virginia being very Sick and Weak in Body but in perfect Sense and Memory thus calling to mind the uncertainty of this life and that it is appointed for all Men to Die: Do constitute and Ordain this my last Will & Testament hereby Renouncing and Disannulling all former Wills by me made Showing that this only may be taken for my

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Item I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Mary Jordan of North
Carolina one Negro Man called Will and one feather Bed & furniture
and Sunday other Things which I have formerly possessed her with
It is all my Desire that she shall have my Negro Boy called Ben
or Twenty five pounds current Money of Virginia paid by my
Executors hereafter named. Item 2. I Give and Bequeath to my
Daughter Elizabeth Richards one Negro Woman called Dinah and
all her Increase to her and her Heirs for Ever, and one Feather
Bed and furniture already Received by her. Also It is my Will &
Desire that she may have my Negro Boy called Sam or Twenty five
pounds current Money of Virginia to be paid by my Executors
hereafter named. Item 3. I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter
Lydia Beel one Negro Woman called Rose and her Son Josias to her and
her Heirs for ever and one feather Bed & Furniture and several
other Things which I have formerly possessed her with I also Give her my
Plantation near Kingsale Mill whereon John Britain now Lives to
her and her Heirs for ever. Item 4. I Give and Bequeath to my
Daughter Martha Lawrence all that Tract of Land I Bought of
Giles Smalley Likewise that Parcel of Land I Bought of John Stafford
Just as the Swamp Runs between John Lawrence and Thomas
Smalley: And half that Tract of Land that I Bought of William Murfee
and all other Things I have possessed her with already. I also Give
her my Negro fellow called Ned to her & her Heirs for Ever and also One
feather Bed and Furniture. Item 5. I Give and Bequeath to my
Daughter Patience Jordan all Things I have already Possessed her with
also I give her my Negro fellow called Dick to her and her Heirs
for Ever I also give her one feather Bed & Furniture. Item 6.
I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Ann Marshall all Things I
have already Possessed her with. also I Give and Bequeath to my said
Daughter Ann my Negro Wench called Hagar & her Son Robt and
my Negro Boy called Peter to her and her Heirs for Ever, and a
feather Bed and Furniture. Item 7. I Give and Bequeath to
my Daughter Mourning Jordan my Plantation I now Live on with
all the Land I possess Except that which I have already Given to
Martha Lawrence and Lydia Beel. I also give to my Daughter
Mourning four Negroes Viz. Jonas, Robt, Tom, and Dwey. to
her and her Heirs for Ever. also for Feather Beds and furniture and
Ten New Russia leather Chairs and Eighteen painted Flagg Bottom'd
D. One large Oval Walnut Table and one Maple D. one Cedar
Desk, one Maple D. one large looking Glass, two Chests, half a
Dozen of pewter Dishes, half a Dozen of pewter Dishes, two Dory
Plates & one sheep and Twelve Head of the three of my Cattle and
fifteen

I have sold of sheep and all the Crops now growing on the same
 All the Rest of my Estate after my Just Debts are paid shall be
 be Equally Divided between my four Daughters vizt. Mary Jordan,
 Elizabeth Pritchard, Patience Jordan, & Miss Rich. My Assurance
 Ann Marshall, and Mourning Jordan and that they allow a propor-
 tionable part to Josiah Jordan and John Lawrence for Collecting my
 Debts and paying of Accounts that may come against my Estate
 according to the Judgment of William Dwyer, Esq. John Scott, Joseph
 White and William Scott Junr. which I do appoint to settle my Estate
 I do make Ordain and appoint my Son in Law Josiah Jordan and
 my Daughter Mourning Jordan & Mary whole and sole Executors &
 Executrix of this my last Will and Testament. This I own to be my
 last Will and Testament Revoking and Disannulling all other Wills &
 Testaments and Desiring that this only be taken for my last Will &
 Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand
 and Seal this 24th Day of June 1746

 but of perfect Sense & Memory & Calling to mind the Certainty of
 Death, but the uncertainty of the Time when and being Willing to settle
 my Temporal Affairs Do make, Constitute and Ordain this my
 last Will and Testament in manner and Form Following. FIRST I
