In the Name of God. Amen. I Alice Miller
of Stafford County in Virginia. being very weak of Body
but in perfect Sense and Memory. Thanks be to God for the
same. I think fit to make, and ordain this my last Will and
Testament in Manner and Form as followeth

Item Give and Bequeath unto my Son George Miller my mare
to him and his Heirs forever. only the S^r George is to raise
the Coll. till it be two Years old. and no longer. and then
to deliver it to his Sister Martha Miller

Item Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Martha Miller
my Feather bed. and the Furniture to it belonging to her
and her Heirs

Item Give and Bequeath unto my three Children. namely
George, Thomas and Martha. all the Rest. of my Estate
be it in what Kind or Sort soever. moveable. or immovable
to be equally divided betwixt them three. And I do appoint
my Son George Miller. my whole. and sole. Executor of this
my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have
herunto set my Hand and Seal this 10th day of January
1750
