Item I Likewise, Give, Devise, and Bequeath unto
my son Arthur Whitehead, and my Brother Lewis
Whitehead, two Hundred acres of Land which I bought
of William Hall, lying and being, upon the North
Side of Northunty swamps and in the County called
by the Name of Johnson, to be equally divided
between

between them and their Heirs forever
Item I Give Demise and Bequeath unto my Son Sargus
Whitehead, all that Survey of Land, which I made in the
Trunk of the former Survey adjoining upon the County
Line, in the Tenth Eight County, to him and his Heirs
forever.

Item I Give Demise and Bequeath unto my Son Jesse
Whitehead, the Plantations that I now live upon, and
all the Land, thereunto, Belonging, that I possess, to him
and his Heirs forever.

Item I Give Demise and Bequeath unto my Son William
Whitehead, one Negro Boy called Foyal, to him and
his Heirs forever.

Item I Give Demise, and Bequeath ~~unto~~ unto my
Daughter, Edeath Whitehead, one Negro Girl called Lucy
to her and her Heirs forever.

Item I Give Demise and Bequeath unto my Daughter
Scallah Whitehead, twenty Pounds Current Money
to her and her Heirs forever.

Lastly all the Rest and Residue, and Remainder of my
Estate, my Will is, that it shall be, equally divided
Between my loving Wife Patience, and my six Children
before named.

And I do hereby Nominate, my loving Brother Lewis
Whitehead, and my loving Wife Patience, to be my full
and Sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament
hereby revoking, and making Void all former and
other Wills, and Testaments, heretofore by me made
ratifying, and confirming, this and no other to be my
last Will and Testament in Witness whereof I have set
my Hand and Seal, this six Day January 1748.
