The last Will and Testament of Charles Chapman deced was presented in Court by Thomas Parker the Executor therein named who refused to take the Executors oath on himself and being proved by the Oath of Timothy Low and West Grofs the Wifeness thereto is Ordered to be Recorded And on the Motion of Joseph Chapman and on his taking the Oath of an Executor and giving Bond as the law directs Certificate is granted him for obtaining Letters of Administration with the Will annexed on the ^{decedents} Estate in due Form.

In the Name of God Amen I Mary Carrell do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament in Manner & Form following (Viz^t)

Item I Give to my son Thomas Carrell a Gold Ring of twelve Shillings and six Pence Weight &c

Item I Give and Bequeath all my Estate Right and Power to my three Children Mary Carrell James Carrell and Richard Carrell to be equally divided between them and to their Heirs forever. —
Also my Will and Desire is that my Son James Carrell may have one Year schooling and my Son Richard Carrell may have two Years schooling more and that my three Children abovementioned shall live with their Brother Thomas Carrell. Whom I do appoint
