

In the Name of God amen I make this my last Will and Testament, First I commend my soul to almighty God who governeth them my Body to the earth from whence it was taken as to all my Estate which it hath I would ^{God} bestow unto me, I give as follows, after my just debts and funerall Expences, being first paid

Item I give to my son Nathaniel Portlock one Negro fellow Named Hercules one Negro Boy Named Sam one Negro Boy Named ^{Negro girl named Dills and one} Harrihot and one Negro woman named Bess and all their increase to him and his Heirs at the age of Twenty one Years of age Likewise I do give to this my said son one Gun and Silver Holsted sword and one Pair of Pistols and my furniture Belonging Likewise a pair of Silver Spurs and one Large Bible —

Item I give to my son Charles Portlock my younger son one Negro fellow Named Harry one Negro Boy Named Durkin one Negro girl named Anne one Negro Woman named Dills and their increase to him and his Heirs at the age of twenty one years of age Likewise I give him one Gun and one small Bible and a feather Bed and furniture to each of My Sons and if either of my two Sons should chance to die before that they arrive to the age of twenty one Years, then the Survivor to have his Part and my Desire is that the two ^{Negro} fellows Leased to my two Sons may be hired out for use by task to the best Bidder to cloath and School these my sons when Capable to take Learning

Item I give to my Loving Wife all the Remainder of my Estate as Negro's Stock and household furniture to eat and do as she shall see whereunto I have set my hand this fifteen Day of February 1750
