Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Son Robert Eley my Blanketing and all the Land belonging to same with all the Appurtenances thereof to him and his Heirs forever only reserving a Priviledge for my loving Wife Alice Eley and my three Daughters Amy Martha and Abigail to labour and
