In the Name of God. Amen. I Elizabeth Beany of the County of Wright being weak in Body but of Perfect sense and memory I do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form as followeth (Viz)

Item I give unto my Cousin Henry Higgs one gilted Tumbler, one Pewter Dish and one Pewter Plate

Item I give unto my Cousin John Higgs one small Iron Pot, one small gilted Tumbler, one Pewter Dish and one Pewter Plate

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Item I Give unto my Son-in-law Mary Jordan one feather Bed
Sheet one Pewee Dish and one Pewee Plate —

Item I Give unto my Grandson Rich^d Jordan one feather Bed
of Bolster Bolstered Matt and Bed and the furniture that be-
-longe unto it and one Desk.

Item I Give unto my Grandson Mathew Jordan my Negre Girl
Nancy Jordan and her Increase, Excepting the first that she has
born alive, I Give to my Grandson Rich^d Jordan above
mentioned and the second that is born alive. I Give to my
Grand Daughter Hannah Jordan (hereafter mentioned)

Item I Give unto my Daughter Mary Jordan the use of a
Chest of Drawers one Dick Pot one Looking Glass. During
her Natural Life and then my Desire is that it all shall
return to my Grand Daughter Hannah Jordan.

Item I Give unto my Daughter Mary Jordan all the Remaining
Part of my Household Goods that is her Husband's Possession

Item I Give unto my Son Francis Brassey five Pounds Current
Money and all the Estate that belongs to me that is in his
Possession —

Item I Give unto my Grand Daughter Mary Outland one
Chest of Drawers one Tea Table one Brass Candle Stick
one Pewee Dish one Pewee Bason, & half a Dozen English
Spoons and twenty two Pounds Current Money all which I
Legacy is in the Possession of John Outland, Excepting the
Money Part, I Give to her the said Mary Outland, if she
lives to the Age of Eighteen or married and in case she do
not live to that age or married then my Will and Desire
is that it shall return to the next Brother or Sister that she
has that born of the Body of my Daughter Elizabeth Out-
land that lives to the age of Eighteen and in case my said
Daughter has no Children live to the age of Eighteen then
my Will and Desire is that this Legacy shall be Equally
Divided Between my Son Francis Brassey and my Daughter
Mary Jordan —

Item I Give unto my Daughter Eliz^a Outland one feather Bed
two Chests and one Table which she is already Possessed with
and all the Rest of my Estate that is in the Possession of John

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John Bullard that I have not already signed
And I do hereby acknowledged this to be my last Will and
Testament, and do appoint Matthew Jordan and Francis
Bracey my whole and sole Executors to be the said Will
performed according to the true Intent and meaning
hereof. As Witness my hand and seal this twenty third
Day of July 1751
