But calling to Mind the uncertainty of this Life, and that it is appointed for all People to Die, do Constitute and Ordain this my last Will and Testament, hereby renouncing and Disannulling all other Former Wills by me made, Desiring that this only may be taken for my last Will & Testament in manner and form as followeth. I give and Bequeath unto my Daughter in Law Mary Heavill, one Heifer with Calf, and four Barrells of good Sound Corn, and as much Fodder, as will winter her Heifer and my Crop of Potatoes, and all the Remainder of my Hogg and my Crop of Cotton, I give it to her and her Heirs forever.

Item. I give and Bequeath unto my Grand-Daughter Rachel Nolleboy, one pair of Stilliards, and one Spinning Wheel that did belong to her Father. I give it to her and her Heirs forever.

Item. I give & Bequeath unto my Grand-Daughter, Elizabeth Garner one Iron Spitt. I give it to her and her Heirs forever.

Item. I give and Bequeath unto my Grand-Daughter Mary Murphy one pewter Plate. I give it to her, and her Heirs for ever.

Item. I give and Bequeath unto my Grand-Daughter Sarah Murphy one pewter plate, I give it to her, and her Heirs for ever.

Item. I give and Bequeath unto my Grand-Daughter Elinor Everitt one pewter Plate. I give it to her and her Heirs for ever.

Item. I give & Bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah Carter One Shilling. I give it to her, and her Heirs for ever.

Item. I give and Bequeath unto my Son Francis Hampton one large Chest. I give it to him and his Heirs for ever.

Item. I give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Marshall all my wearing Apparell. I give it to her & her Heirs for ever.

Item. I give and Bequeath unto my Son in Law, James Marshall one feather Bed and the Furniture belonging to it and one Brass Kettle. I give it to him and his Heirs forever. And as for all the Remaining part of my Estate that I have not already disposed of, after my Just Debts and Legacies paid my Will and Desire is, that it shall be equally divided between James Marshall & Francis Hampton.
