Judith, One Silver Dish, and One Bason, and three Plates, two Cows
and Calves One Bed and Furniture -

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Hannah, One Negro Girl called
Violet Two Silver Dishes, One Bason, and three Plates, two Cows, and
Calves and one Bed and Furniture, commonly called her Bed, and
one Iron Pott. -

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Son Thomas Davis Grofs, one Negro Man
called Harry One Negro Girl called Sink, two Silver Dishes, One Bason
and three Plates, one Bed and Furniture that I usually lie on -
three Heifers, one of them called his own, one Sow and Pig called his
own and one small Iron Pott. -

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Son Jonathan Grofs, my old Negro Woman
called Lucy, one Bed and Furniture, Two Silver Dishes and three
Plates and one young Heifer -

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Bevan, wife of Robert
Bevan, one Cow, and Calf -

My Will is that all the Residue of my Estate of what kind soever
be sold at publick Sale, towards paying of my Debts, and I do
nominate and appoint, my Son Joshua Grofs, and my Daughter
Patience Grofs, to be whole and sole Executor and Executors
of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I
have hereunto set my Hand, and affixed my Seal, this 18th day
of September, One Thousand seven Hundred and fifty -
