

In the Name of God Amen the 14th day of April in the Year of our Lord 1751. I George Miller of Virginia in the County of Isle of Wight, being very sick and weak in Body, but of perfect Mind and Memory Thanks be given to God, therefore calling to mind the Mortality of my Body and that it is appointed for all Men once to die do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament. That is to say principally and first of all, I Give and Recommend my Soul into the Hands of God that gave it me, and for my Body, I Recommend it to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like, and decent Manner at the Discretion of my Executor, Nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection, I shall receive the same again by the mighty Power of God, and as touching such Worldly Estate whereas — it has pleased God to bless me in this Life, I Give and Devise and Dispose of the same, in the following Manner and Form —

I Give and Bequeath my whole Estate to my Brother and Sister, Thomas Miller and Martha Miller, to be equally divided between them two. I Do hereby appoint my loving Brother Thomas Miller, my whole and Sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament. *Witness*, my Hand and Seal —
