

In the Name of God. Amen. I George Parker of the Isles of Wight County in Virginia being of full Age & Weak in Body but in perfect Sense and Memory of Mind do proceed to make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form as followeth —

Item. I give and Bequeath to my loving Wife Martha Parker one feather bed, with all the Furniture thereunto belonging, my Coll, and vide Saddle, One Chest, and one looking Glass that was her Father's I leave my loving Wife the Use of my Plantation — during her Widowhood. I also leave her my Boy Anthony two Years.

Item. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mourning One small gilted Trunk, and one Pound in Cash —

Item. I give and Bequeath to my Son James my Wearing Cloaths, and the Use of y^e other Year of my Boy Anthony I leave to him.

Item. I leave my Daughter Ann Twenty Shillings in Cash for her Schooling —

Item. I give to my Daughter Sarah five Pounds in Cash. —

Item. I give to my Eldest Daughter Isabell one Shilling. — All the Rest of my Estate after all my Debts is complied with I give to my loving Wife and three Daughters namely Mourning, Ann and Sarah, and my Daughter Isabell's first Child to be equally Divided amongst them. My Will & desire is that my loving Wife and my trusty Friends, Thomas Parker be my whole and sole Exe^r: to see this my last Will and Testament to be performed and done according to the true Intent and meaning thereof. In Witnes^s whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and fixt my Seal this 15th day of May, in the Year of our Lord 1747 —
