 Buildings, and all other Improvements thereon during her
 Life, and after her Decease the Plantation to my Brother
 Luke Wiggs, and all the Improvements thereto belonging to him
 and his Heirs for ever

Item. I give unto Elizabeth Brassey my Sister the Use of One
 Negro Man called Dick during her Life, and after her Decease
 to my Brother Luke Wiggs

Item. I give unto my Cousin Elizabeth Brassey Forty Pounds in
 Cash, and the best Bed and Furniture as I have got and one
 Brass Kettle, one Dutch Pott and Hooks, one Iron Rack
 and four Dishes, and one Dozen New Plates

Item. I give unto my Brother Luke Wiggs one Silver Dish, and two long fingers and one little Dish, and three Cans and Calers, after my Cousin Elizabeth Brassey have taken her Choice of the Bed and Furniture, the rest best to my Brother Luke Wiggs, and one Pot and Hooks —

Item. I give unto my Sister Elizabeth Brassey all the Remainder of my Estate and to her Disposal —

I make my Sister Elizabeth Brassey my whole, and sole Execut^{ix} of this my last Will and Testament. July 30th 1747. —
