 last Will and Testament. (Revoking all other Wills). As
 followeth, and my Body to be Buried at the Discretion
 of my Executors hereafter named.

Item. I give to my Son William Pitt Thirty Pounds to be
 paid to him out of my Estate by my Executors.

Item. I give to my Son Joseph Major Pitt One Shilling.

Item. I give to my Son Thomas Pitt my Skill.

Item. I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Bagnall the Use
 of my Negro Woman Jane and my Negro Boy Jers during
 her Natural Life and after her Decease to be equal
 divided amongst her Children.

Item. I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Bagnall one Shilling.

Item. I give to my Daughter Ann Driver the Use of my
 Negro Woman Rose, and the Use of my Negro Boy Rke
 during her Natural Life and after her Decease to be
 divided amongst her Children.

Item. I give to my Grand-Daughter Lydia Benn five
 Pounds to be bestowed upon her for Cloathing and one
 Year Schooling.

Item. I give to my Grand Daughter Anne thirty Pounds to be laid out for a Negro Girl for her as soon as possible, there is any to be sold, if she live to the Age of Twenty Years, if she does not live to that Age then to be divided amongst the Rest of my Children hereafter named —

Item. I give to my Son Henry Pitt my great Coat. —

Item. I give my Son Henry Pitt one Shilling —

Item. I give to my Daughter Patience Fulgham the Use of two Negroes named Jack and Torrey during her Natural Life and after her Decease to be equally divided amongst the Rest of my Children hereafter named —

Item. I give to my Daughter Patience Fulgham eight Barrel of Indian Corn —

Item. I give to my Daughter Patience Fulgham five Head of Cattle —

Item. I give to my Daughter Ann Driver my wearing Fan And all the Rest of my Estate I give to be equally Divided amongst my Children hereafter mentioned, — Patience Fulgham, Ann Driver, Henry Pitt. — I do appoint my Son Henry Pitt, and my Daughter Patience Fulgham my whole Executors of this my last Will and Testament Revoking all former Wills by me made. In Witness hereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this Ninth Day of December One Thousand Seven Hundred and forty seven —

At a Court continued & held for Isle of Wight County Aug. 12. 1748
The last Will and Testament of Henry Pitt Deceased was presented in Court by Henry Pitt one of the Executors there who made Oath thereto, and being proved at a former Court held for this County January 14. 1747 by the Oath of David Williams, William Bagnall, and Richard Bagnall

I Matthew Jordan, of the Isle of Wight
 County, Virginia, being Weak in Body but of sound Mind
 Memory and Understanding, Do make and declare this my
 last Will and Testament in manner and form following to-wit:
 1st of all, I give and bequeath unto my loving Wife
 Dorothy Jordan six Negroes to her and her Heirs forever
 to-wit: Peter, Tom, Moll, Hannah, Bob and Mingo. Also
 one Horse, Bridle, and Saddle, two feather Beds and
 Furniture, Also one third part of what Money I shall
 leave at my Decease. I also give and devise unto my
 Wife Dorothy the plantation I now live on with
 my Copper Still and all Utensills during her Natural
 Life, and after her decease, then I give and devise the said
 plantation and Still to my Son Josiah Jordan and his
 Heirs for ever. Also I give my Wife Dorothy all the
 Crop on the Ground, all the Stock of Hogg, and half the
 Cattle and Sheep which shall be on the plantation at
 my Decease

Still above. Deceased after his Mother's Decease.
Item. I give and Bequeath, to my Son Matthias Jordan
all the Land I bought of my Cousin Matthers Jordan
commonly called Bell's Point, there being of it two
Plantations with all Stock of Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, Horses
&c. that are upon them. Also Six Negroes to him and his
Heirs for ever to wit / Scipio and his Wife Hannah
Esther, Jerry, Patty, and young Scipio. Also one Silver
