In the Name of God Amen. I John Davis, being very sick and weak, but of sound, and perfect Sense of Mind, and Memory, Thanks be to Almighty God, for the same, Do make and Ordain, this my last Will, and Testament in Manner and Form following

 I give and Bequeath unto my said Son Samuel my Negro Tom, and after his Death, if without lawfull Issue, then to go and Descend, to my Nephew, William Goodrich. Likewise give and Bequeath, my Pistols, and Holsters, in the same above-mentioned Manner,

and all.

And, all the Residue and Remainder, of my Estate and for-
 Sakers, may be sold to pay my just Debts, and I do nominate
 and appoint John Goodrich, to be my whole and sole Executor
 of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof
