Amos I John English of the Idledlight County, being sick and weak in Body perfect Memory and hence, blessed be God for the same but calling to mind the Uncertainty of this frail Life do therefore think fit to make this my last Will and Testament and first and principally, I Recommend my Soul unto God, that gave it, and my Body to the Earth, from whence it came to be buried in a Christian-like Manner, and it is my Desire that, after all my just Debts are justly satisfied, that all my Estate both real and personal, disposed of as followeth Viz.

Item, I Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Amos English four Pounds out of my moveable Estate, to her and her Heirs, ^{for ever} and no more

Item, I Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Mary English four Pounds out of my moveable Estate, to her and her Heirs forever, and no more

Item, I Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Charity English four Pounds out of my moveable Estate, to her and her Heirs forever, and no more

Item, I Give and Bequeath unto my loving Wife Mary English the Plantation I now live on, and all the rest of my Estate within Doors and without

And Lastly, I Do Ordain, Constitute and Appoint my Wife Mary English, my whole Sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament, Revoking & annulling all Wills by me heretofore made, or caused to be made, In Witness whereof, I have hereunto set my Hand, and

In the Name of God. Amen. the 28th day of November
 1748. I Mary Council of the Islet of Wight County and Parish of
 Newport in Virginia having lived to the Age of very near
 Seventy one being at this Present in Health of Body and
 of perfect Mind and Memory I praise the Lord therefore
 and calling to Mind the Uncertainty of this Life and
 knowing that is appointed for all Men once to die have
 thought fit to make this my last Will and Testament
 in the following Manner and Form. First I recommend
 my Soul into the Hands of almighty God that gave it
 and my Body to the Grave to be decently buried in
 Christian Burial at the Discretion of my Executors
 hereafter mentioned. and for my Worldly Estate that it
 hath pleased God to bless me withall I Give and
 Bequeath the same in the following Manner and Form
 First I leave to my beloved Wife Susannah the
 Use and Command of all my Negros during her
 Natural Life and the Plantation whereon we now live
 for
