

In the Name of God Amen, I John Pierce of the Parish and County of Isleslight being sick and weak but of perfect and disposing Memory do make and Ordain this to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form as followeth, vizt.

Impromises. I Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth Pierce the Plantation whereon I live —

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Mourning Pierce the Sum of Fifteen Pounds sixteen Shillings current Money —

Item I Give unto John Seagraves the Son of Susannah Seagraves the Sum of twenty three Pounds nine Shillings and four pence half Penny current Money when he comes to the age of twentyone and in case he should not live to that Age then the said Sum to return to my Daughter Mourning Pierce —

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my wife Catharine Pierce all the Rest of my Estate after my Debts and Legacies is paid, and after her Decease it is my desire that my two Daughters should have it, Divided between them, And I do hereby Nominate and appoint my trusty Friends William Pierce and Charles Norrwoth my Executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby utterly Revoking and disannulling all other and former Wills and Testaments by me made, and Declaring this and no other to be my last Will and Testament
