The last Will and Testament of John Joyner deceased
was presented in Court, by Absolam Joyner the Executor
therein named, who made Oath thereto, and being proved
by the Oath of Chaplain Williams, & Henry Crafford
two of the Witnesses thereto, and ordered to be recorded ————

In the Name of God. Amen I John Pitt
of the Isle of Wight County being sick and weak of Body,
but of perfect Mind and Memory, Thanks be to almighty
God, I make this my last Will and Testament as
followeth ————

Item I give and Bequeath unto my Son John Pitt the Plantation
whereon I now live, as high as the Thunderstruck Poplar
in Bridges Line, as so across the Land to a white Oak
in Monroes Line, and so down to the Creek as the line
goes, and up in the Woods, for Fire Wood, fencing, and Timber
as far as the Freshitt ————

Item I give and Bequeath unto my Son Edmond Pitt as the
Plantation whereon John House now liveth, and the
said Plantation, is bounded as high as Holladay's Land
and what licks of the other Side Holladay's Land to the
Freshitt Swamp ————

Item I give & Bequeath unto my Son John Pitt, my
Negro Man called Luke & my Negro Man called
Peter ————

Item I give and Bequeath unto my Son Edmond Pitt my
Negro Boy called Sam ————

Item I give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth Pitt
my

165 my Negro Woman called Sarah, & her Child Ferrell and my Negro Boy called David

Item I give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Pitt. and my Daughter Lidian Pitt. my Negro Woman called Mollen and my Negro Girl called Prefs. and their Increase. to be equally divided between them.

Item I give ^{and Bequeath} unto my Son Joseph Pitt my Negro Boy called Harry

Item I give and Bequeath my Negro Girl called Judith & her Increase. to be equally divided between my three Sons. John Edmond and Joseph Pitt. and if one or more of my ^{my} Children should die without Heirs. lawfully begotten of their Body. That then their Parts. to be equally divided among the rest of my ^{my} Children.

I do leave my Land over the Freshitt. to be sold at publick sale. and the Money arising from the Sale to go to discharging my Debts

Item I give unto my Son John Pitt. my Paul Colt. my Chasse and Bridle. Pistols and Holster. and my Desk

Item I give unto my Son Edmond Pitt. my Saxe of Bottles and my little Colt. called his and John Saddle

Item I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth Pitt. one Mare and her Mothers Saddle and Bridle

Item I give the rest of my personable Estate after my lawfull Debts is paid. to be equally divided among all my Children. and I do appoint my Brother Joseph Pitt. and my Brother in Law Thomas Goddwin my whole and sole Executors. of this my last Will and Testament. As Witnes my Hand and Seal. this 17th Day of November 1748
