In the Name of God. Amen. I John Powell of Isle of Wight County being Sick and Weak in Body but of Sound and perfect Memory praise be given to God for the same; and calling to Mind the Mortality of my Body and that it is appointed for all Men Once to Die, do make and ordain this to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form as followeth VIZ

FIRST and principally I commit my Soul to Hands of the Almighty God my Creator assuredly believing that I shall receive full pardon, and free Remissions of all my manifold Sins and Transgressions thro' the Merits of my only Lord and Saviour Christ Jesus. And my Body to the Earth whence it was taken to be Buried, Decent and Christianly manner as to my Executor hereafter named shall seem fit. And as touching such Worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased the Almighty God of his most gracious

and Bounteous Mercy to bestow on me in this life
I give as followeth (that is to say) My last Will and
My Will and Desire is that all such Debts and Duties &
Demands as I owe in Right or Conscience to any Person
or Persons whatsoever be well and truly paid by my
Executor hereafter named within convenient Time after
my Decease.

Item. I give unto my Son Joshua Powell five Shillings
Worth out of my moveable Estate and no more.

Item. I give unto my Son John Powell the worth of five
Shillings out of my moveable Estate and no more.

Item. I give unto my Son William Powell the worth of five
Shillings out of my moveable Estate and no more.

Item. I give unto my Son Joseph Powell my Negro Child
Verus and one Shilling out of my moveable Estate &
no more.

Item. I give unto my Daughter Patience Norworthy
the worth of five Shillings out of my moveable &
no more.

Item. I give unto my Daughter, Ann Pierce the worth of
five Shillings out of my moveable Estate and no more.

Item. I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth Johnson the worth
of five Shillings out of my moveable Estate & no more.

Item. I give unto my loving Wife Sarah Powell my Plantation
whereon I now live on to her and her Disposing. And
further I give unto my Wife my Negro Wench ^{named} Nan
and Negro Jack; and all the Remainder of my moveable
Estate within Doors and without Doors to her & her
Disposing.

Item. I do hereby Revoke, Disannull, and make Void all
Wills, Testaments, and Legacies by me heretofore made,
and do declare this and no other to be my last Will and
Testament. And Lastly I do hereby Nominate & appoint
my loving Wife Sarah Powell and John Darden my
Executors of this my last Will and Testament. In
Witness whereof I have set my Hand this third day
of

13 September in the Year of our Lord 1748.
