White and William Scott Junr. which I do appoint to settle my Estate
I do make Ordain and appoint my Son in Law Josiah Jordan and
my Daughter Mourning Jordan & Mary whole and sole Executors &
Executrix of this my last Will and Testament. This I own to be my
last Will and Testament Revoking and Disannulling all other Wills &
Testaments and Desiring that this only be taken for my last Will &
Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand
and Seal this 24th Day of June 1746

Summerrell of the County of Solis of Wight being Sick & Weak of Body
but of perfect Sense & Memory & Calling to mind the Certainty of
Death, but the uncertainty of the Time when and being Willing to settle
my Temporal Affairs Do make, Constitute and Ordain this my
last Will and Testament in manner and Form Following. FIRST I
Recommend my Soul to God; and my Body to the Earth to be Buried in
such Decent manner as my Executors hereafter Named shall Think
proper and as to my Temporal Estate I Dispose of as Follows
Imprimis. My Will and Desire is that my Negroes the one
named Michael and the other Tugnor be Sold by my Executors for the
Best Price that can be got for them towards paying of my Just Debts
Item I Give and Bequeath to my Loving Wife Elizabeth Summerrell
the whole Use and Profits of my Land and Negroes and other my goods

my said Natural Life and after her Death to be Divided
between my two Daughters Sarah and Jean Summerrell, as hereafter
mentioned. **Item** I give and Bequeath to my Daughter Sarah
Summerrell The plantation I now live on to her and her heirs for ever.
I likewise Give to my said Daughter one Negro Girl called Hope
when my said Daughter comes to Age or Married. **Item** I Give
Bequeath to my Daughter Jean Summerrell The Land which I
bought of Thomas Pitt to her and her heirs for ever and likewise
one Negro Girl called Nancy when my said Daughter comes to Age or
Married. And as to the Residue of my Personal Estate my Desire
is that it be Equally Divided between my Loving Wife & two Daughters
my said Daughters to have their part when they come to Age or
married and after my said Wife's Decease the said Negroes which I gave
her the Use of during her Natural Life to be Equally Divided between
my said two Daughters Sarah and Jean Summerrell, and I do nominate
and Appoint my Loving Wife Lydia Summerrell to be whole Sole
Executrix of this my last Will and Testament. **In Witness**
whereof I have hereunto set my Hand & Affixed my Seal this
Fourteenth Day of February, One Thousand Seven Hundred and
Forty Five
