I Give unto my beloved Wife Penelope Bullock to support my Children and bring them up withall. And I do appoint my beloved Wife Penelope Bullock my whole and sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament to see it performed. Whereunto I have fixed my Hand and Seal —
