Item I Give unto my Daughter Tabitha Weston one Feather Bed and Furniture Three Cows one Oval Table one Gold Ring one Chest four Pewter Dishes and six Pewter Plates one Pot one frying Pan, to be delivered to the said Tabitha when she comes to age. —

My Will and Desire is that my loving Wife Mary Weston have the use of the remaining Part of my Estate both Real and personal

Marriage. I give my Negro Boy Peter unto my Daughter. —
Ann Smith. And I give my Negro Boy Dick unto my
Daughter Mary Weston. And I give my Negro Girl Glos unto
my Daughter Tabitha Weston. I give the rest of my Estate to
be equally divided between my Wife and three Daughters. Ann
Mary and Tabitha. and I do appoint my loving Wife Mary
Weston to be my whole and sole Executrix of this my last
Will and Testament. as Witness my Hand & Seal, this 24th Day
of September 1748. —
