And do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament in a
manner and Form as followeth this 19th Day of August and in the
Year of our Lord 1746. First I give my Soul unto the Hands of
Almighty God who gave it me. Secondly my Body to be Decently
Buried at the Discretion of my Executors. As for my worldly Goods
as it hath pleased God to Bless me with I give & Bequeath in
manner and Form as followeth

First I give unto my Dear and well beloved Wife during her Natural
Life in Widewidhood my two Negroes / Viz^t / Judy and Warris
Item I give and Bequeath the first Negro Child that my dear
Judy shall Bring unto my Daughter Elizabeth Hambwell

39 Item. I give and Bequeath the second Child the Wench shall have unto my Daughter Patience Wombwell.

Item. I give and Bequeath the third Child my Wench Judy shall have, to my Daughter Sarah Wombwell.

Item. I give and bequeath the said Wench Judy and the rest of her Increase unto my Son Jesse Wombwell.

Item. I give and Bequeath unto my Son Matthew Wombwell my Negro Sam.

Item. I give and Bequeath unto my Son Jesse Wombwell all the plantation whereon I now live, And when my two Sons shall arrive at the Age of Twenty one Years, then my Son Jesse Wombwell shall pay unto his Brother Matthew Wombwell half the Value of the said Land.

Item. I give and bequeath 4 pounds on the Schooling of my two Sons Jesse Wombwell and Matthew Wombwell.

Item. I give and Bequeath 3 pounds Cash to School my three Daughters viz. Elizabeth, Patience and Sarah.

Item. I give and bequeath the third of my Estate unto my Wife Ann Wombwell, and the Remainder to be Equally Divided between my two Sons and three Daughters.

Item. I do make and Ordain my Dear Wife Ann Wombwell my whole and sole Executrix.
I do acknowledge to be my last Will and Testament whereunto I have set my Hand the Day and Year above Written.
