perfect Sense and Memory Thanks be to God for the same do
appoint this to be my last Will and Testament. Imprim.
I Bequeath my Soul to God that gave it and my Body to them
whom shall be thought fit by my Exec^{rs} hereafter named. For what
worldly Goods I possess I Desire it should be bestowed as followeth.
Item. I give and Bequeath to my two Brothers Henry & Arthur
Joyner all my Lands left me by my Father to be Equally Divided
between them, Arthur to have the plantation in his part, and to
them and their Heirs forever.
Item. I give to my Brother Arthur Joyner my Mare, and then
sell to my Brother Henry Joyner.
Item. I give all the Rest of my Estate to be Equally Divided between
Henry Joyner, Arthur Joyner, Prudence Long and my Sister
Mary Syms and Sister Martha Joyner. Also I give to my
John Joyner five Shillings. And also to Martha Drake five
Shillings. Also I appoint my two Brothers John & Henry
Joyner to Exec^{rs} of this my last Will. As Witnesses my
Hand and Seal this 30th day of December 1746.
