In the Name of God. Amen. I Mary Ewum of the
 County of Solefright being in good Health and Perfect
 Memory Blessed be God therefore do make and Publish this
 my last Will and Testament in manner and form following
 (that is to say) —
 I ~~do~~ commend my Soul into the Hands of Almighty God
 who gave it me and my Body to the earth from whence it came
 in hopes of a joyfull Resurrection, through the merit of my
 Saviour Jesus Christ and as for that Worldly Estate wherewith
 it hath pleased God to bestow I Dispose thereof as follows
 First I give to my son Francis Ewum the Bed and furniture where
 on I now lie and one Silver Cup to him and his Heirs
 Item I give my Daughter Elizabeth Smith five Pounds Current
 Money and one Gold Ring to her and her Heirs
 Item I give to my Daughter Olive Williamson one Negro Fellow
 called Henry to her my said Daughter and her Heirs

On Condition that if my said Daughter Mary Crum
 cause to be paid to my Daughter Ann Williamson the full
 and just Sum of Twenty pounds Current Money but on
 failure thereof, It is my Will and Desire that my Executors
 hereunto mentioned keep the above said Negro Fellow Harrow
 and pay to each of my aforesaid Daughters Ann and
 Ann Williamson the Sum of Twenty Pounds Curr. Money
 I give to my Daughter Mary Crum and to her Heirs for
 ever all the Rest and residue of my Estate be it of what Nature
 or kind soever, and do appoint my said Daughter Mary
 Crum my whole and sole Executrix of this my last Will
 and Testament. hereby revoking Disannulling and making
 Void all other Wills by me heretofore made. In Witness
 whereof I the said Mary Crum have hereunto set my hand
 and affixed my seal this first Day of June 1749
