The last Will and Testament of Daniel Day deceased was presented in Court by Mary Day the Executrix therein named who made Oath thereto and being proved by the Oath of Edward Taylor and Joseph Taylor two of the Witnesses thereto and Ordered to be Recorded

In the Name of God. Amen. I Robert Eley son of the Islip Light County being weak in good sound and perfect Sense and Memory. Blessed be God but calling to mind the Uncertainty of this frail Life, and that it is appointed for all Flesh to die I therefore do make this my last Will & Testament in Manner and Form as followeth.

Item I Give and Bequeath unto Son Gale Eley all Land that I bought of Mary Barker to him and his Heirs forever. Also my short gun and my Case of Pistols and Sword one Feather Bed and Furniture also one Cosh and one Brown two Plates.

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Son Robert Eley my Blanketing and all the Land belonging to same with all the Appurtenances thereof to him and his Heirs forever only reserving a Brevidge for my loving Wife Alice Eley and my three Daughters Amy Martha and Abigail to labour and

- and the said Slave, during their single Lives, —
 and I also give to my Son Robert my Gun with the Ammunition
 I give and Bequeath unto my loving Wife, Miss Eley, my
 Negro Woman called Frank, and my Negro Boy called
 Tom, the Labour of them, to her during her single Life, and
 after I give my Negro Boy Tom, to my Son Robert
 Eley, to him and his Heirs forever. I also give him
 one Feather Bed, and Furniture, and one Dish, one
 Basin, two Plates. —
- I give to my Daughter Miss Daddone, one Heifer, & two
 Hay, Chacks, and one round Table —
- I give, and Bequeath, to my Daughter Amy Eley, one Dish,
 one Basin, and one Negro Boy called Hercules to her &
 her Heirs lawfully begotten forever, and for Want of such
 Heirs to return to the Heirs of the Family. —
- I give and Bequeath to my Daughter Martha Eley, one
 Negro Boy called Gibbs to her and her Heirs forever
 one Dish, one Basin, and two Chairs. —
- I give and Bequeath, to my Daughter Rebecca Eley, one
 Bed, and Furniture, one Dish, one Basin, and two Plates.
- I give unto my Son Gale Eley, one Negro Boy called Mingo
 to him and his Heirs forever —
 And if it please God, that my Negro Woman should increase
 my Will and Desire that should descend to my Daughter
 Miss Garden, and my Will, and Desire, that one should
 descend my Daughter Rebeckah, to them and their Heirs forever
- I give unto my loving Wife Miss Eley, all my Estate within
 and without, all my Household Goods, Stock, Cattle, Hogs,
 Horse, and Man, and Sheep, to her and her disposing —
 only my Negro Woman, is my Will & Desire, that she should
 ascend, to my Son Robert Eley, to him and his Heirs forever
 I do Constitute, and Ordain this to be my last Will, & Testament,
 and do revoke all other Wills made by me, or suffered to be
 done by me or any other Person sower. And I do appoint
 my loving Miss Eley my Executrix, and my Son Gale Eley
 to be Executor, ^{also} with his Mother, to see this my Will
 done
