Isle of Wight County 10th of February 1741. In the
 Name of God. Amen. I Ralph Fickers
 of the Isle of Wight County being of Great Age and calling to mind
 the uncertainty of this Life and knowing that it is appointed for
 all Men Once to Die. I do make this my last Will & Testament
 in manner and form following. FIRST and principally I
 recommend my Soul unto Almighty GOD that gave it. And
 my Body to the Grave to be Decently Buried at the Discretion
 of my Executors hereafter named. And as for my Worldly Estate
 that it hath pleased GOD to Bless me withall in this World
 I Give and Bequeath the same in the following manner and
 form Viz^t
 I Give and Bequeath unto my Grandson Thomas Boykin &
 my Grandson Simon Boykin all that Tract of Land that I
 bought of Benjamin Boykin to be equally between them the v.

Thomas and Simon, to them their Heirs and Assigns and if either of the v. Brothers shall be Deceased and if he shall sell any part of the v. Land my Will and Desire is that the Seller give his Brother the first Choice, at the same Price as he shall Demand of another Person, and if he shall refuse the same, then he shall have the Liberty to sell to any other Person, to them their Heirs and Assigns forever.

Item. I also Give my Grand-Daughter Martha Boykin a free privilege to live on the v. Plantation as long as she shall live Single.

Item. I give and Bequeath unto my Grand-Son Thomas Boykin One Negro Man name Tom to him his Heirs & Assigns for ever.

Item. I give and Bequeath unto my Grand-Son Simon Boykin one Negro Boy named Dick to him his Heirs & Assigns for ever.

Item. I give and Bequeath unto my Grand-Daughter Martha Boykin one Negro Boy called Ned, and one Negro Girl called Joy and their Increase to my v. Grand-Daughter her Heirs and Assigns for ever. I also give to my Grand-Daughter Martha Boykin one Negro Woman called Nan, to her & her Heirs and Assigns forever.

Item. I give and Bequeath unto my Grand-Son Thomas Boykin one Negro Boy called Peter to him and his Heirs and Assigns forever. And further my Will is that if my v. Negro Woman called Nan should Increase for the future that the next living Child, that shall be Born of the v. Nan I give to my Grandson Simon Boykin, to him his Heirs & Assigns forever.

Item. I give to my Daughter Margaret Vaughan the Wife of Thomas Vaughan One Shilling Current Money, it being all that I give to her. And I do hereby Bar the v. Thomas Vaughan from any Right or Claim to any part of my Estate. And further my Will is that my Daughter Margaret have Liberty to live on the Plantation that I bought of Benjamin Boykin as long as she shall see fitt. And as for the said v. Plantation and Land I now live on, I leave to the Discretion of my Executor, and the Value to be Equally Divided between my

my three children, Thomas, Simon, & Martha Boykin
 And for all the rest of my Estate, Moveable and Immoveable I
 leave to be equally Divided between my three Grand-Children
 Thomas, Simon, and Martha Boykin. And further my Will
 is that if my Daughter Margaret Vaughan should out live her
 present Husband, Thomas Vaughan that then she shall have
 the Property of the whole Estate during her Natural Life, only
 reserving the full Property of the s^d. Estate, to my three Grand-
 Children after her Decease. And I do make and Ordain my
 loving Brother, Abraham Carnall my Sole Executor of this
 my last Will and Testament. *In Witness* whereof I have
 hereunto set my Hand and fixed my Seal, In the presence of
 these Witnesses, this Day above Written.

The last Will and Testament of Ralph Vickers Deceased was

 Recorded. And the s^d. Abraham Carnall refusing to take the
 Executorship on himself. Therefore on the Motion of Simon
 Boykin, and his taking the Oath of an Administrator, and giving
 Bond as the Law directs. Certificate is Granted him for
 obtaining Letters of Administration with the Will annexed on
 the s^d. Decedent's Estate in due Form.
