Ordain, this my last Will and Testament, this sixth Day of
February, In the Year one Thousand, Seven Hundred forty
five. In Manner and Form as followeth (viz) I comit my
Self into the Hands, of Almighty God, my Creator, Preserve, me
Through the Merits of Jesus Christ, to obtain everlasting
Life, and for my Worldly Estate, as Goods, Chattels, & Lands
I do give and Bequeath as followeth.

I Give and Bequeath all my Estate to be equally Divided
Between my Wife Mary Webb, and my Children that lives
now with me. My Daughter Martha having had a

Portion already and I do also appoint my Wife Mary Webb
and Joseph Webb Executors of this my last Will and Testament
as Witness my Hand this 6th Day of February 1745/6
